INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act 1950 Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following further amendments to the amended list published in the London Gazette on the 7th
