Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Hemsworth, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Helen's Church, Hemsworth, and in the extension of the churchyard at Westfield Road, Hemsworth:
