TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 11th June 1965, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th June 1965, to Saturday the 19th June 1965, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny)

which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1965

Extinguishment of a Public Right of Way County Borough of Swansea

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 155 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public right of way enjoyable by vehicular traffic over part of Dynevor Place, Swansea.

A copy of the draft Order and a map showing the land over which the right of way proposed to be extinguished subsists may be inspected at the Town Clerk's Department, The Guildhall, Swansea, during usual office hours.

Any objections to this proposal must be made in writing and addressed to the Secretary, Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff, before the 4th day of September 1965.

The Secretary of State is not in all cases required to cause a local inquiry to be held. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Treventy, Cross Hands Side Road) Order 1965

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Treventy, Cross Hands in the County of Carmarthen he has made an Order under section 9 of the above Act, the effect of which is to authorise the Secretary of State to carry out improvements to the Cefnethin—Treventy Road, all at Treventy, Cross Hands aforesaid.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff, where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours. Certified copies have also been deposited at the offices of the County Council of Carmarthen, County Hall, Carmarthen where they are similarly open to inspection.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Treventy, Cross Hands Side Road) Order 1965" can be obtained from the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highway Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 3rd June 1965, apply to the High Court for
