The Progressive Wilt Disease of Hops Order, 1965

1. Notice is hereby given that the Minister of 1. Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made an Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, entitled The Progressive Wilt Disease of Hops Order, 1965.

2. This Order re-enacts the Progressive Verticillium Wilt of Hops Order, 1957, with amendments, and comes into force on the 14th June 1965.

3. Occupiers are required to give to the Minister

3. Occupiers are required to give to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food notice of the presence, or suspected presence, on their farms of progressive wilt disease of hops and to destroy dead or dying bines and leaves of hop plants on infected

4. Hop plants grown on an infected farm are not to be planted elsewhere except under licence and restrictions are imposed on the planting of hop plants grown in Herefordshire, Surrey, Hampshire,

and Sussex.

5. The Minister or an inspector may, by notice served on the occupier of infected land, impose other requirements or restrictions with a view to

preventing the spread or recurrence of the disease. These include-

(a) the destruction of entire hop plants or of the bines and leaves of hop plants;

(b) control of the cropping of land;

(c) the erection and maintenance of fencing;
(d) the treatment, destruction or other disposal of soil or things capable of harbouring or spreading progressive wilt (e.g. destruction of hop waste or treatment of machinery);

(e) restrictions on the movement of hop plants, hop poles and material derived from hop plants.

6. If the requirements of the notice are not carried out the inspector may act in default. Certain occupiers and other persons may be required to give information about the purchase, planting, sale, offer for sale, disposal or movement of hop plants, hop poles or material derived from hop plants and to produce relevant records and other documents.
