

Tennant Street Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the north side of Islington Row for a distance of 30 yards in a north-easterly direction.

William Street Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the north side of Islington Row for a distance of 30 yards in a north-easterly direction.

George Road Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the south side of Islington Row for a distance of 40 yards in a southerly direction.

Calthorpe Road

(a) South-east side, from the line of the kerb on the south side of Islington Row for a distance of 83 yards in a south-westerly direction.

(b) Both sides, between a point 64 yards south-west of the line of the kerb on the south-west side of St. James Road and a point 25 yards north-east of the line of the kerb on the north-east side of St. James Road.

St. James Road Both sides between its junction with Calthorpe Road and its junction with Frederick Road.

Hagley Road Both sides, between its junction with Broad Street and a point 118 yards east of the line of the kerb on the north-east side of Francis Road.

Ladywood Road Both sides, between its junction with Board Street and its junction with Grosvenor Street West.

Francis Road Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the north side of Hagley Road for a distance of 45 yards in a north-westerly direction.

Granville Street Both sides, between its junction with Broad Street and a point 17 yards south-east of the line of the kerb on the south-east side of Tennant Street.

No waiting, Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m.—1 p.m. and Monday to Friday, 4.30 p.m.—6.30 p.m.

Waiting limited to thirty minutes in any hour, Monday to Saturday, 1 p.m.—4.30 p.m.

Broad Street North-west side, between a point 129 yards north-east of the line of the kerb on the north-east side of Bridge Street and its junction with St. Martins Street.

No waiting, Monday to Friday, 1.30 p.m.—4.30 p.m. and Saturdays, 2 p.m.—4.30 p.m.

Waiting limited to thirty minutes in any hour, Monday to Friday, 8 a.m.—1.30 p.m. and Saturday, 8 a.m.—12 noon.

Broad Street South-east side, between a point 129 yards north-east of the line of the kerb on the north-east side of Bridge Street and its junction with St. Martins Street.

No waiting, Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m.—6.30 p.m.

Harborne Road Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the north-west side of Calthorpe Road for a distance of 150 yards in a south-westerly direction.

No waiting, Monday to Friday, 4.30—6.30 p.m.

Harborne Road Both sides, from a point 150 yards north-east of the line of the kerb on the north-east side of Greenfield Crescent for a distance of 88 yards in a north-easterly direction.

Unilateral no-waiting, Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m.—6.30 p.m. Operating so that one side of the road is the subject of no waiting for the first fifteen days of the month and the other side for the remainder of the month. On the side where waiting is permitted waiting will be limited to thirty minutes in any hour.

Francis Road Both sides, from the line of the kerb on the south side of Duchess Road for a distance of 129 yards in a south-easterly direction.

The Orders to give effect to these proposals contain an exemption in respect of the loading and unloading in all the lengths of road set out above.
