The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. That Schedule VII of the Order in Council of 3rd August 1960, relating to Flying Extra Pay be modified to include Royal Marine Observers in Unit Light Aircraft.

2. That Schedule IV of the Order in Council of 3rd August 1960, relating to the issue of Special Service Pay be modified as in the Schedule to this Order.

*Special Service Pay (Flying) Royal Marine Other Ranks—Unit Light Aircraft Helicopter Pilots*

### THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT 1868

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 10th day of June 1965, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute 4 of the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the *London Gazette* in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Harrow School on the 10th day of June 1965

WHEREAS Statutes for the Government of Harrow School were made by the Governing Body of the said School under the Public Schools Act 1868 and approved and sealed by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Act on the 24th day of February 1874.

And Whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the Powers for this purpose conferred upon them by section 11 of the said Act have resolved to alter Statute 4 of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing.

Be it enacted as follows:

1. The School established and maintained in the Parish of Harrow by the Governing Body pursuant to the said Statute under the name "The Lower School of John Lyon" shall henceforth be called and known as "The John Lyon School".

2. In all other respects Statute 4 of the above mentioned Statutes shall remain in force (subject to all subsequent amendments hitherto enacted) save that the name "The John Lyon School" shall be deemed to be substituted for the names "The Lower
