## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 3rd September 1965, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £210,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 6th September 1965, to Saturday the 11th September 1965, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
6. Notification will be sent by post on the same days as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 7) Order, 1965. This Order:

- (i) increases the rate of drawback of import duty on specified imported poly (vinyl chloride) tubing used in the manufacture for export of specified

casing bags for sausages and prepared meats, and

- (ii) increases the rates of drawback of import duty on imported crushed and uncrushed bones used in the manufacture for export of glue, gelatine and other specified bone products.

The Order comes into operation on the 2nd September 1965, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1965, No. 1627.

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order 1965.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempted from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempted from import duty, until 31st December 1965, unless a shorter period is indicated against any item.

## HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

*The Fishguard — Aberystwyth — Dolgelly — Caernarvon — Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (Bronaber — Capel Jerusalem, Trawsfynydd Improvement Side Roads) Order 196*

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above-mentioned trunk road at Trawsfynydd in the county of Merioneth to make under section 9 of the above Act an Order which will:

- (a) authorise the Secretary of State:

- (i) to carry out improvements to Bronaber—Pen-y-Stryd Road and North of Byrdir—Pont-y-Gnible Road.

- (ii) to stop up part of the Bronaber—Pen-y-Stryd road, and

- (iii) to construct a new highway to connect the Bronaber—Pen-y-Stryd road with the Trunk Road,

all at Trawsfynydd aforesaid, and

- (b) provide for the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Merioneth as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.
