The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a footpath off Barleyfields Road, at Wetherby, Yorkshire, in order to enable residential development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to N. REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948**

Public Health (Imported Food) Regulations, 1937 and 1948 Southern Rhodesia
