Dourine (exanthema coitale paralyticum) has never existed in Great Britain.

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely: one Mercedes motor vehicle, German registration number B-ER18, found on 30th July 1965, on land adjoining No. 2 Railway Cottages, Beckford, Cheltenham, have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that on 6th March 1964, at Dover, the said Mercedes motor vehicle, being goods chargeable with a duty of customs, was on importation allowed to be delivered without payment of duty on condition that the said Mercedes motor vehicle would be re-exported not later than on 6th March 1965, and the said condition has not been observed.

Whereby and by force of section 257 (1) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a Solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Comliable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
