The Westminster (Various Roads) Experimental Traffic Order 1965

The Greater London Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the London Government Act 1963, has made an Order which came into operation on 26 September 1965 and which:—

1. institutes one-way working in specified roads in the City of Westminster;
2. prohibits four right turns in that City;
3. suspends existing Regulations relating to four right turns, one one-way working and the appointment of parking places;
4. imposes restrictions on waiting by vehicles, and waiting for the purposes of loading and unloading goods, in certain roads.

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HAMPSHIRE RIVER AUTHORITY

Amendment of Land Drainage Byelaws

Notice is hereby given that the Hampshire River Authority intend, after the expiration of the period mentioned below, to apply to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food for confirmation of the following amendment to Land Drainage Byelaw No. 9 made by the River Authority:

By the addition of the following:

"or, in relation to any part of the river that is contained in a culvert, over the culvert or within ten feet of either side of it."

The amended Byelaw would then read as follows:

"9. No person without the consent in writing of the Authority shall plant any tree shrub willow or other growth within ten feet on the landward side of the brink of the river or, in relation to any part of the river that is contained in a culvert, over the culvert or within ten feet of either side of it."

Copies of the amended Byelaw will be deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the River Authority, The Castle, Winchester, and will be open to inspection without payment on any weekday during the usual office hours for one calendar month from and after the date of the publication of this notice. Copies of the Byelaw will also be supplied free of charge on request.
