

*Town and Country Planning Act 1962**Newquay*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a footpath at Stoke Canon, Devon, in order to enable residential development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to L. NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949

Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (Designation) Order, 196

Notice is hereby given that the National Parks Commission propose to make and submit to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation the above-mentioned Order.

2. The effect of the proposed Order which will not come into operation until confirmed by the Minister of Housing and Local Government will be to constitute the land to which the proposed Order relates an area of outstanding natural beauty for the purposes of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

3. The proposed Order relates to land situated in the Counties of Gloucestershire, Oxfordshire, Wiltshire and Worcestershire and comprises land within the under-mentioned districts:

Municipal Borough of Cheltenham.
Urban Districts of Charlton Kings, Cirencester, Nailsworth and Stroud.
Rural Districts of Cheltenham, Cirencester, Dursley, Gloucester, North Cotswold, Northleach, Sodbury, Stroud, Tetbury, Warmley, Chipping Norton, Witney, Calne and Chippenham, Malmesbury, Evesham and Pershore.

4. A copy of the proposed Order and of the map referred to therein has been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Council of each of the areas mentioned above, and will be open for inspection free of charge during office hours. Copies may also be inspected at the offices of the National Parks Commission, 1 Cambridge Gate, Regent's Park, London, N.W.1.

5. Any representation with reference to the proposed Order should be sent in writing to the Secretary, National Parks, Commission, 1 Cambridge Gate, Regent's Park, London N.W.1, so as to arrive not later than the 26th day of November 1965, and any such representation should state the grounds on which it is made.
