Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.

SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Ashbourne Rural District Council (Atlow Footpath)
No. 1 Diversion Order 1965*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 23rd day of October 1965 and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public right of way on foot running from the south-east corner of Field No. 72 (Ordnance Sheet Derbyshire No. 38/12, Edition 1922) in a northerly direction to the Henmore Brook, a distance of 147 yards or thereabouts, and thence in a north-easterly direction across Field No. 63 for a distance of 97 yards or thereabouts, such footpath being 3 feet in width and shown coloured brown on the map; and to create a public right of a way on foot (1) from the south-east corner of Field No. 72 in a north-easterly direction to the northern boundary, continuing in a northerly direction to the Henmore Brook a distance of 180 yards or thereabouts and thence in a northerly direction across Field No. 63 for a distance of 70
