The Newport—Monmouth—Ross-on-Wye—Worcester Trunk Road (Mitchel Troy—Raglan Diversion Side Roads) Order 1965.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 9 of the above Act providing-

 (d) that Monmouthshire County Council shall

The Trunk Road (Sennybridge) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1965
