

Southern Rhodesia, and goods of a part of the Commonwealth preference area which are consigned from Southern Rhodesia, no longer qualify for Commonwealth preference on importation into the United Kingdom. The rate of duty on goods entered for warehousing before the commencement of this Order will not be affected.

The Southern Rhodesia (Property in Passports) Order 1965

Made - - - - - 16th November 1965
Laid before Parliament 17th November 1965
Coming into Operation 18th November 1965

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 16th day of November 1965.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council
Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 2 of the Southern Rhodesia Act 1965, 1965 c. 76, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order shall apply to any document purporting to be a passport or other document establishing a person's identity and nationality (hereafter in this Order referred to as "a passport") issued on or after 11th November 1965 by, in the name of, on behalf of or under the authority of, any person or body of persons claiming to exercise any governmental functions in relation to Southern Rhodesia, not being a passport which is the property of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the preceding paragraph, the reference therein to any person or body of persons claiming to exercise governmental functions in relation to Southern Rhodesia shall include a reference to a person or body of persons claiming to be the Government of Southern Rhodesia or to be a Minister or Ministers of that Government or otherwise to be entitled to exercise authority on behalf of that Government.

2. A passport to which this Order applies may be dealt with within the United Kingdom as though it were the property of Her Majesty's Government therein and, accordingly—

- (a) an immigration officer;
- (b) a constable, or
- (c) any other person designated for the purpose by or on behalf of the Secretary of State,

may, if so authorised by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, take and retain possession of such a passport; and any passport retained by virtue of this Order shall be disposed of in accordance with directions given by or on behalf of the Secretary of State.

3. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Property in Passports) Order 1965 and shall come into operation on 18th November 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order provides that a document which purports to be a Rhodesian passport issued on or after 11th November 1965 may be dealt with in the United Kingdom as though it were the property of the Government of the United Kingdom. Accordingly, authorised persons may take and retain possession of such a document.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council
Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 2 of the Southern Rhodesia Act 1965 (1965 c. 76), is pleased, by and with the advice

of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Section 1 of the Commonwealth Immigrants Act 1962 (10 and 11 Eliz. 2. c. 21) (which provides that Part I of that Act shall have effect for controlling the immigration into the United Kingdom of certain Commonwealth citizens) shall have effect as if any passport issued by the Government of the United Kingdom to a person who is a Commonwealth citizen by reason only of his citizenship of Southern Rhodesia were not a United Kingdom passport as defined in subsection (3) of that section.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Commonwealth Immigrants Act 1962) Order 1965 and shall come into operation forthwith.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Section 1 of the Commonwealth Immigrants Act 1962 provides that the provisions of that Act for controlling the immigration into the United Kingdom of Commonwealth citizens shall not apply to a person who holds a United Kingdom passport (defined as one issued by the Government of the United Kingdom otherwise than on behalf of a Commonwealth country) issued in the United Kingdom or the Republic of Ireland.

This Order provides that section 1 shall have effect as if any passport issued by the Government of the United Kingdom to a person as a citizen of Southern Rhodesia were not a United Kingdom passport. Accordingly, the provisions of the 1962 Act relating to the control of immigration will apply to a citizen of Southern Rhodesia notwithstanding that he has been so issued with a United Kingdom passport.

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 2 of the Southern Rhodesia Act 1965 (1965 c. 76), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding the provision of paragraph (a) of section 3 (1) of the British Nationality Act 1958 (6 & 7 Eliz. 2. c. 10) that (subject to limited exceptions) no person shall be registered as a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies under section 12 (6) of the British Nationality Act 1948 (11 & 12 Geo. 6. c. 56) (as amended by the said section 3 (1)) on an application made after the end of the year 1962, a citizen of Southern Rhodesia (and any of his minor children) may be so registered on an application made at any time while this Order is in force.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (British Nationality Act 1948) Order 1965 and shall come into operation on 18th November 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Section 12 (6) of the British Nationality Act 1948 (as amended by section 3 (1) of the British Nationality Act 1958) made provision for the registration as citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies of certain persons who would have been citizens thereof but for their citizenship or potential citizenship of a country mentioned in section 1 (3) of the Act of 1948. Save as provided in section 3 (1) (c) of the Act of 1958 and in Schedule 1 to the South
