The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Chepstow Inner Relief Road) Order 196 , and

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Chepstow Inner Relief Road Side Roads) Order 196

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. an Order under section 7 of the above Act providing:

(a) that Upper Nelson Street at Chepstow in the County of Monmouth and a new road that he proposes to construct to connect Upper Nelson Street with the London—Fishguard Trunk Road near Hardwick Avenue shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and

(b) that the length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the County Council of Monmouth (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that Upper Nelson Street and the new road are open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under section 9 of the above Act authorising the Secretary of State:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;

(b) to stop up a length of Hardwick Avenue;

(c) to construct a new highway to connect Hardwick Avenue and School Hill with the new trunk road, all at Chepstow aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of the said highway to the County Council of Monmouth as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours from 31st December 1965 to 31st March 1966, at the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff, and at the offices of Monmouth County Council, County Hall, Newport, and Chepstow Urban District Council, Regent House, Chepstow.

Any person may not later than 31st March 1966 object to the making of the Orders, by notice to the Secretary of State quoting the reference RD 75/2/230/03 and stating the grounds of objection.

The Minister of Power, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Electricity Acts, 1947 and 1957, and the Regulations made thereunder has appointed Sir Alan Wilson, F.R.S., a part-time member and Deputy Chairman of the Electricity Council constituted under the said Acts.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT 1934

The Minister of Power hereby gives notice of the determination by the Licensee with effect from 1st March 1966, of five prospecting licences granted under the provisions of the Petroleum (Production) Act 1934 and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1935, as amended, to Superior Oil (U.K.) Limited, Chestergate House, Vauxhall Bridge Road, London S.W.1.

Descriptions of the boundaries of the areas covered by the licences were published in the *London Gazette* dated 12th June 1964. The areas are as follows:

- (1) 186 square miles in the counties of Buckingham, Hertford and Middlesex.
- (2) 183 square miles in the county of Hertford.
- (3) 190 square miles in the counties of Bedford, Hertford and Middlesex.
- (4) 192 square miles in the counties of Bedford, Buckingham and Hertford.
- (5) 196 square miles in the counties of Cambridge, Bedford and Hertford.
