- 1. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Exports) (Tobacco) Order 1966 and shall come into operation forthwith.
- 2. Tobacco, whether unmanufactured or manufactured and including tobacco refuse and tobacco extracts and essences, is hereby specified for the purposes of Article 1(1) of the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Exports and Imports) Order 1966.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

### (This note is not part of the Order)

This Order specifies tobacco for the purposes of Article 1(1) of the Southern Rhodesia (Prohibited Exports and Imports) Order 1966. This has the result of prohibiting the exportation of tobacco from Southern Rhodesia and certain ancillary transactions except so far as may be authorised by regulations of the Secretary of State.
