MIDDLETON BOROUGH COUNCIL

(Fountain Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1966

Notice is hereby given that the Middleton Borough Council on the 7th February 1966, made an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as

amended, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the following length of road:

The southerly side of Fountain Street between its junction with Manchester New Road (A.664) for a distance of 15 yards in an easterly direction.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to permit the loading or unloading of goods from a vehicle and to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads or the services therein, or to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situate on or adjacent to the above lengths of road. The Order has no application to any stage or express carriage and will come into operation on the 7th March 1966.
