The Greater London Council are about to consider a proposal that they should make an Order under section 10 of the London Government Act 1963, to impose restrictions on waiting by vehicles between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in:

The Broadway, Stanmore, the main carriageway between a point 130 feet west of the west side of

its junction with Glebe Road and its junction with London Road.

London Road, between its junction with The Broadway, Stanmore, and a point 45 feet northeast of the eastern kerbline of Dennis Lane.

The restrictions would also apply to the first 45 feet of both sides of Dennis Lane, Glebe Road and Marsh Lane measured from their junctions with The Broadway.

A Traffic Management Order, entitled the Newham (Prescribed Routes) Traffic Order 1966 (1966, No. 7) has been made by the Greater London Council.
