Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 4th March 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 7th March 1966, to Saturday the 12th March 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 2) Order, 1966.

This Order removes the import duty on all citrus peel which is not either fresh or frozen.

The Order comes into operation on the 3rd March 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966 No. 172.

(i) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on:

(a) imported linseed oil used in the manufacture for export of adducts of linseed oil and synthetic resins,

(b) imported soya beans used in the manufacture for export of synthetic resins and paint, enamel and varnish, and
