ROYAL BOROUGH OF KINGSTON UPON THAMES

The Kingston Upon Thames (No. 6) Smoke Control (Variation) Order 1966

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above-mentioned Act on the 10th day of November 1965, confirmed, with modification, a Smoke Control Order entitled the "Kingston upon Thames (No. 6) Smoke Control Order 1965".

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, made an Order entitled the "Kingston upon Thames (No. 6) Smoke Control (Variation) Order 1966", which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Variation Order provides that fireplaces in the area which are specified in the Schedule hereto (which were included in the area declared by the Kingston upon Thames (No. 6) Smoke Control Order 1965 to be a smoke control area) shall be exempted from the operation of the said section 11 upon the conditions specified in respect thereof in the said Schedule.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of December 1966 or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

A copy of the Order may be inspected free of charge at the Guildhall, Kingston upon Thames, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 5th March 1966.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF MIDDLESBROUGH

The Middlesbrough (Lodore, Mandale and Levick) Smoke Control Order, 1966

1. Notice is hereby given that the Middlesbrough County Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 8th day of February 1966, made

an Order entitled the Middlesbrough (Lodore, Mandale and Levick) Smoke Control Order, 1966, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke controlled area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order, and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before 1st July 1967, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

4. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Middlesbrough, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 4th March 1966.

5. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke, and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of September 1967, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.
