#### WEST SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of West Suffolk (High Street and Queen Street, Haverhill) (Unilateral Waiting) Order, 1962, Amendment Order, 1966.*

*The County of West Suffolk (Various Streets, Haverhill) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that on the 17th day of February 1966, the West Suffolk County Council made Orders under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is

1. To amend the "County of West Suffolk (High Street and Queen Street, Haverhill) (Unilateral Waiting) Order, 1962" so that a system of unilateral waiting shall apply in Queen Street from a point 68 yards of its junction with Withersfield Road on the north-east side for a distance of 52 yards and from a point 77 yards of its junction with Withersfield Road on the south-west side for a distance of 43 yards.

2. Subject to the usual exemptions to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in the following lengths of road:—

- (a) Queen Street (south-west side) from its junction with Withersfield Road for a distance of 77 yards.
- (b) Queen Street (north-east side) from its junction with Withersfield Road for a distance of 68 yards.
- (c) Withersfield Road (south-west side) from its junction with Queen Street for a distance of 71 yards.
- (d) The Pightle (south-west side) from its junction with Withersfield Road for a distance of 40 yards.
- (e) The service road in front of the Woolpack Inn between the Pightle and Queen Street, a distance of 29 yards.
