Substitution of Schedule to the 1964 Order

2. For Schedule 1 to the 1964 Order (assessment of disablement caused by specified injuries and of certain other disablements) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in Part II of the Appendix hereto.

Amendment of Article 14 of the 1964 Order

3. In Article 14 of the 1964 Order (constant attendance allowance) there shall be made the amendment set out in Part III of the Appendix hereto.

Commencement

4. This Order shall come into operation on 21st March 1966, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to 21st March 1966, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following 21st March 1966.

APPENDIX

PART I

1. *Article to be added to the 1964 Order*

"Exceptionally severe disablement allowance"

14A. Where the disablement of a member of the naval forces is, and in the opinion of the Minister is likely permanently to remain, such that he is, or if he were not in a hospital or other institution would be, in receipt of an allowance for constant attendance at a rate increased under the proviso to Article 14, he may be awarded an allowance at the appropriate rate specified in Schedule 6, paragraph 2A."

2. *Amendment of Article 21 of the 1964 Order*

In paragraph (b) of the proviso to Article 21(1) (treatment allowances) for the words and figures "Article 13, 16 17(1)(i) or 18" there shall be substituted the words and figures "Article 13, 14A, 16, 17(1)(i) or 18".

3. *Paragraph to be added to Schedule 6 to the 1964 Order*

"2A. Exceptionally severe £156 60s.
disablement allowance per annum per week".

NOTE.—Where the scheduled assessment for a specified injury involving multiple losses differs from the sum of the assessments for the separate injuries, the former is the appropriate assessment.

PART III

Amendment of Article 14 of the 1964 Order

Article 14 (constant attendance allowance) shall be numbered paragraph (1) and at the end of the proviso thereto there shall be added the following paragraph:—

"(2) In this Article the expressions "retired pay" and "pension" have the same meaning as they have for the purposes of Article 16."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further amends the Order of 25th September 1964.

Article 1 introduces an allowance at the rate of £156 a year in the case of officers and 60s. a week in the case of ratings for certain pensioners who have a permanent disablement of exceptional severity.

Article 2 amends the table of assessments in Schedule 1 to the 1964 Order by adding forequarter and hindquarter amputations, each with an assessment of 100 per cent., and by increasing the scheduled assessment for amputation below mid-thigh and above the knee, or at the knee not resulting in an end-bearing stump, from 60 per cent. to 70 per cent.

Article 3 corrects a minor error of omission in the 1964 Order.
