Notice of proposal to apply for an Order authorising the stopping up or diversion of a highway

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich being the highway authority for the highway hereinafter mentioned intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at Market Street, Woolwich S.E.18, on Tuesday, the 19th day of April 1966, at the hour of 1.30 in the afternoon for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the part of the highway known as Parsons Hill, Woolwich, for a distance of 261 feet from St. Mary Street northwards to its junction with John Wilson Street, to be stopped up on the ground that it is unnecessary.

The effect of the proposed Order is shown on the plan deposited at the offices of the council at Town Hall, Woolwich S.E.18, where it may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on weekdays (excluding Saturday).

KIDSGROVE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Kidsgrove Urban District Hollinswood Farm, Clough Hall Extinguishment Order 1965

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th day of March 1966 the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public rights of way over:

- (1) Footpath No. 10 which starts on the east side of Park Avenue 33 yards north of the junction of the said Avenue with Clough Hall Road and Beech Drive and runs south-east for a distance of 210 yards to the path's junction with footpaths Nos. 11 and 15.
- (2) Footpath No. 11 which starts at the path's junction with footpaths Nos. 10 and 15 and runs east for a distance of 90 yards to the north-west corner of Bathpool Wood.
- (3) Footpath No. 15 starts at the path's junction with footpaths Nos. 10 and 11 and runs south-east for a distance of 60 yards to the east side of Westmorland Avenue and then runs south-west and north-west for a total distance of 283 yards to the path's junction with the access road running to Hollinswood Farm.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Town Hall, Kidsgrove, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 22nd day of March 1966, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959 or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Settle Rural District Council (Jop Ridding, Austwick) Public Path Diversion Order No. 1, 1966

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 8th day of March 1966 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert a length of the public right of way (footpath No. 24) running from the Austwick-Helwith Bridge Road to a point at a field gate between O.S. Fields No. 573 and 575 South of Jop Ridding starting at a bend in the footpath North of Jop Ridding in O.S. Field No. 574 at a point marked "S" on the plan attached to the Order and extending in a general southerly direction for about 137 yards passing through a stock yard at Jop Ridding and continuing through O.S. Field No. 573 to a point marked "T" on the deposited plan in O.S. Field No. 575 where it joins path No. 23 (which latter path leaves the above-mentioned Road South-east of Town Head, Austwick, near Bench Mark 484.4 proceeding in a South-easterly direction to Flascoe Bridge and thence in a North-easterly direction to rejoin the above-mentioned Road via Wood Lane to the South of Far End House) to a line running from the point "S" on the deposited plan to a bend in footpath No. 24 North of Jop Ridding in a South-easterly direction for a distance of some 107 yards crossing into the southern extremity of O.S. Field 576 and passing into O.S. Field No. 575 by means of a stone stile to be constructed in place of a wooden hurdle, to join path No. 23 West of the gateway between O.S. Fields No. 575 and No. 675 at a point marked "X" on the deposited plan.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Settle Rural District Council, Town Hall, Settle, during office hours.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 18th day of April 1966, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

GRAVELEY WITH YELLING CORN RENTS

In the Matter of an Act of Parliament passed in the Fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George III entitled "an Act for inclosing lands within the Parish of Yelling, in the County of Huntingdon, and for compensation for the Tithes".

Take notice that an application will be made by the Church Commissioners for England (in whom the corn rents formerly payable to Rector of Yelling are now vested by virtue of the Tithe Act 1925 and the Church Commissioners Measure 1947) at the Quarter Sessions of the peace to be held in and for the County of Huntingdon and Peterborough on the 12th day of July 1966 for the nomination and appointment of three persons to be arbitrators for ascertaining the average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat within the said County of Huntingdon and Peterborough for the 14 years then last past to the intent that the amount of the said corn rents may be varied pursuant to the first above-mentioned Act.
