A PROCLAMATION

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas by the Emergency Powers Act 1920, as amended by the Emergency Powers Act 1964, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that there have occurred, or are about to occur, events of such a nature as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And Whereas the present stoppage of work among merchant seamen does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act of 1920, as so amended:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act of 1920, as so amended, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
