PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Worstead, in the County of Norfolk, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Worstead Churchyard, in the said Parish:

Provided that—

In the grave space reserved for that purpose the burial may be allowed at her decease of the body of Sarah Norgate subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 25th day of July next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 25th day of July.
