The Secretary of State in connection with the proposal to make an Order under section 153 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 authorising the diversion of footpaths at the Afon Crafnant, Trefriw, in order to enable development consisting of a new channel for the Afon Crafnant to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Gwynedd River Authority by Caernarvon County Council and Denbigh County Council.

The Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (Garthmyl Improvements Side Roads) Order 1966

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Pantyllip-Sleddau Improvement Side Road) Order, 1966

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 3rd June, 1966 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
