

## DUKINFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Dukinfield (Vicarage Street) Smoke Control Order (No. 10), 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the Dukinfield Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 9th day of May 1966, made an Order entitled the Dukinfield (Vicarage Street) Smoke Control Order (No. 10), 1966, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of December 1966, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order (and of the Map referred to therein) may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Dukinfield, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 2nd day of June 1966.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## SCHEDULE

The area is bounded on the north side by a line drawn down the north curtilage of the land fronting Vicarage Street from Lodge Lane to the western curtilage of St. John's Vicarage; on the east side by a line drawn down the western curtilage of St. John's Vicarage from Vicarage Street to the rear boundary of 4 Cumberland Avenue; on the south side by a line drawn along the rear boundaries of 4 and 2 Cumberland Avenue and 20 to 2 Westmorland Avenue; on the west side by a line drawn along the rear boundaries of 104 to 94 Lodge Lane and 36 to 30 Lodge Lane, thence along the eastern boundary of the footpath from the northern gable of 30 Lodge Lane to Vicarage Street.

## LONDON BOROUGH OF BARNET

*Clean Air Act, 1956**London Borough of Barnet Smoke Control Order (No. 3) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 9th day of May 1966, made an Order entitled the London Borough of Barnet Smoke Control (No. 3) Order, 1966, declaring the area described in the Schedule below to be a smoke control area. The Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11(4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st July 1967 or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the Map to which it refers may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, The Burroughs, Hendon, N.W.4, at

all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 10th June 1966.

Within that period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## SCHEDULE

Area bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of the road bridge over the London Transport Board railway at the southern end of Ballards Lane and running north-westwards along the centre of the railway line to where it crosses the Dollis Brook: thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the Dollis Brook to a point in the centre of the junction of Lullington Garth and Argyle Road and thence south-easterly along the centre of Argyle Road and along the centre of Alexandra Grove to a point in the centre of Ballards Lane: thence south-westerly along the centre of Ballards Lane to the point of commencement.

The boundary of the area is defined and is shown more particularly by the map referred to in the Order.

*The London Borough of Harrow Smoke Control Order (No. 12) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Harrow, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, on the 19th day of May 1966, made an Order entitled the London Borough of Harrow Smoke Control (No. 12) Order, 1966, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order, and by virtue of section 11(4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before 1st July 1967, or on such later date as may be determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order, and of the Map referred to therein, may be inspected, free of charge, at the Office of the Town Clerk, Harrow Weald Lodge, 92 Uxbridge Road, Harrow Weald, Harrow, Middlesex, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 9th day of June 1966.

## SCHEDULE

An area of the Borough, approximately 288 acres in extent and situate in the Pinner South Ward, bounded by a line, commencing on the north along the London Transport Railway (Metropolitan Line); continuing on the west by the Borough boundary with the London Borough of Hillingdon; turning east along the rear boundaries of the properties on the northern side of Cannonbury Avenue and then north along the rear boundaries of the properties on the western side of Cannon Lane, thence along Eastcote Road and Marsh Road.

The area contains 1,541 privately-owned dwellings, 126 Council-owned dwellings, 35 commercial premises (shops, offices, etc) and the following fourteen other premises, namely:—
