In the Parish of Wotton-under-Edge

(a) Church Street (B.4058) between its junction with Old Town and its junction with Long Street, but excluding that part of the west side thereof between a point 57 yards south of its junction with Old Town and a point 18 yards north of its junction with Long Street.
