NEW PARISHES MEASURE 1943

Notice is hereby given that Her Majesty in Council was pleased on the 9th June 1966, to make an Order in Council approving a Scheme framed by the Church Commissioners for (1) constituting a new district and eventual parish to be called "the District (or Parish) of Hattersley" and to be taken out of the parishes of Mottram in Longdendale and Godley cum Newton Green, and (2) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Mottram in Longdendale and Godley cum Newton Green, all in the diocese of Chester.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, 28 & 29 Vict. c. 73, it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend the Order concerning pensions and other grants in cases where the disablement or death of members of the naval forces is due to service during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is

pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order in Council dated 25th September 1964, as amended Orders of 22nd December 1964 and 24th February 1966, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined (hereinafter referred to as "the 1964 Order") shall be amended in the respects set out in the following provisions of this Order.

Extension of period of temporary allowances to certain widows and unmarried dependants who lived as wives of severely disabled pensioners

1. In Article 33 of the 1964 Order (temporary allowances to widows and unmarried dependants who lived as wives of severely disabled pensioners) there shall be made the amendment set out in the Appendix hereto.

Commencement

2. This Order shall come into operation on 6th July 1966.

APPENDIX

Amendment of Article 33 of the 1964 Order

In paragraph (a) of Article 33 (2) (temporary allowances to widows of severely disabled pensioners) after the words and figures "for the period of 13 weeks" there shall be inserted the words and figures "or, where the member dies on or after 6th July 1966, 26 weeks".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further amends the Order of 25th September 1964 by extending the period for which temporary allowances are payable to widows, and unmarried dependants who lived as wives, of severely disabled pensioners whose death occurs on or after 6th July 1966.
