PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS 1937 AND 1948

Argentine Republic

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that the recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in 1 and 2 of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *London Gazette* of 15th March 1938, design 2 in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *London Gazette* of 11th March 1952, and designs 1, 2 and 3 in the Schedule to the Notice published in the *London Gazette* of 7th July 1964, is hereby modified to the extent that the recognition is restricted as shown in the Schedule hereto.
