BLACKPOOL COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Blackpool (No Waiting) (Princes Way and Ripon Road) Order 1966

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Blackpool in exercise of their powers under subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 26 and subsection (4) of section 27 of the Road Traffic Act 1960 and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf propose to make an Order the effect of which will be:

(d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road;

(e) in the case of any webicle owned by a funeral

(e) in the case of any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with the conduct of a funeral;
