*The Maidenhead Borough Council (King Street)
(Traffic Regulation) (Experimental) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the Maidenhead Borough Council propose to make application to the Minister of Transport for a direction that the above-mentioned Order, which came into operation on the 9th May 1966, shall continue in force for such further period as may be specified in the direction, being a period ending not later than 6 months after the Order came into force.
