

Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 18th July to Saturday the 23rd July 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962
