HONOURS AND AWARDS

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers, to give orders for the undermentioned award of the British Empire Medal.

*Awarded the British Empire Medal for Gallantry
(Civil Division)*

George Patrick CONNOLLY, Seaman, m.v. "Cape Don", Fremantle, Western Australia.

A motor launch, 14 feet in length, used to transport men and materials to and from the lighthouse vessel m.v. "Cape Don" and shore stations, was returning to the vessel from Adele Island when it ran into rough seas and sank. To reach the "Cape Don" it had to negotiate some difficult reefs and to travel about four miles heavily loaded with equipment used by the working party and with seven men aboard. The First Mate, who was in charge of the launch, was unable to swim. After the launch sank he was supported in the water by Seaman Connolly until help arrived. It was a feat of endurance and self sacrifice for the waters around Adele Island, which is located off the north-west coast of Western Australia, are notorious for the prevalence of sharks.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 26th August 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £210,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 30th August to Saturday the 3rd September 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for.

Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
