PART I

To prohibit, except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform, any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on any of the lengths of road specified in Column 1 hereof otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to that length in Column 2:

2. Direction

From north to south.

From east to west.

High Street, between its junction with Lowfield Street and its junction with From west to east.

Market Street. From south to north. Lowfield Street, between its junction with Market Street and its junction with

High Street.

Market Street (except the two car parking areas and the carriageways immediately

to the north thereof):

(a) between a point 156 feet from the junction with High Street and a point opposite to the southern boundary of No. 20 Market Street.

(a) West side between its junction with High Street and a point 189 feet south (a) West side between its junction with High Street and a point 189 feet south of that junction. (b) From a point opposite the eastern boundary of the Library to a point 420 feet in a westerly direction. (c) From its junction with Market Place to a point 60 feet to the south. (d) The carriageway north of the eastern island site from the junction of Market Place easterly for a distance of 63 feet on the northern side. (e) Carriageway north of the western island site from its junction with Market Place westwards for a distance of 159 feet on the northern side, and from the western end of such carriageway a distance of 30 feet on the

southern side. Western side from a point 69 feet south of its junction with High Street to its junction with Market Street.

To prohibit, subject to the usual exemptions, the waiting of vehicles on the following lengths of road including waiting to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from vehicles:

High Street south side, Lowfield Street east side, and Market Street north side, from a point opposite the party wall between No. 9 and No. 11 High Street, to a point in Market Street 66 feet east from the junction with Lowfield Street. High Street south side and Lowfield Street west side from a point opposite the east wall of No. 3 High Street, to a point opposite the south wall of No. 13 Lowfield Street.
