Bre are lately come in 3 thips from the Southwards, one from the Barbados, and one from Sr. Malos; the last telling us that the French are much concerned for the loss of a great Man of War coming out from Havre de Grace and defigned for the East Indies. Several thips are here fitting up to be employed in the Fithing trade to Newfoundland.

Dover, Fcb. 5. The continuance of cro's winds and ill weather, keeps off all Commerce from this Port, exdept of fome few thips which have been forced into this Harbor for fhelter. We expect dayly the news of fome thips wreck; upon the e Seas, many pieces of Planks and other materials of broaken Vessels having been lately taken up neer this place.

Mosco, Dec. 25. The Great Duke being returned hither, aud declaring his inclinations to marry, feveral propolals have been made to him of the gr at it beauties within his Dominions, amongst the rest, two onely feem to be favoured by the Great Duke, one of them a Merchants daughter, and in greatest probability of being preferred to this bed.

The Treaty between the Great Duke and Tattars is faid to be concluded with fome advantage; the Tattars being content to receive 200 thousand Liures tribute for three years, whereas they pretended to an arrear for 13 years; by this Treaty they are all obliged to reft re Collonel *scherem:tet*, a General of Ruffia formerly taken pritoner by them; to his liberty; upon the payment of 7000 Rixdollats for his ranfome: the Great Duke intends fuddenly to diffearch away an Envoy to the Tattars to be preclution of this peace, feveral prifoners of quality taken by our people ard to be also fet at liberty.

A rine late rencember on the fiontiers between a party of our forces and the Tartars has not at all prejudiced this Treaty, especially fince it appears that the greatest loss has faller upon forme German Compani.s.

stratsbourg, Ian. 23. The States General of the United Provinces have endeavoured to fettle a right underfantling bitween the Electors of Mayence and Palatine and the Duke of Lorrain, and for that end and purpole thave influcted the Heer Hamel Bruining thei intended Refident to the Empercurs Court at Vienna on his way to negotiate with those Princes, and to interpole their mediation, which he has accordingly fuccetsfully perf rm-ed with the Elector of Mentz and Duke of Lorrain, the latter more particularly embracing their interpolition, entertaining their faid Minifler with extraordinary civility, and difmiffing him with a Prefent to the value af 300 Pistols ; the laid Duke at his departure particularly obliging him in his application to the Emperour to affare his Imperial Majefly of his inclination to ferve the interest of his houfe, and that he fhould not be eafily drawn into any obligation to his prejudice. The Prince Elector Palatine has yet fome feruples which remain ur fatisfied; the Heer Hamel Braining arriving here from Nancy, departs this dry intending for Heidleberg to give the faid E-lector all p flible fatisfaction, but if he find him not to be eifily won upon to accept of the offered Mediation, siter some little stay to purlue his intended journey for Vienas

The Bifliop of this place, has lately cauled to be made and lent into France a confiderable number of Buf costs.
