Mofco，Dec．25．The Great Duke being returned hither， aud declaring his inclina．ions to marry，feveral propofals Kave been made to him of the gr ats It beanties wishin his Dominions，amongit the teft，two onely feem to be fa－ voured by the Great Duke，one of thim a Merchants daugher，and in greatelt probability of be ng preferred to tris bed．

The Treaty between the Great Duke and Tartars is faid to be concluded with fonke atvantage；the Tartars be－ ingeontent to receive 200 thouland Liures tribute for three years，whereas they precended to an arrear for 13 years： by this Treaty they are aldo obliged to reft re collonel Scheremitet，a General of Rufia formerly taken prionn－ ef by them，to his liberty；upon the payment of jooo Rixdolldrs for his ranfome ：the Great Duke intends fud－ dently todifparch away an Envoy to the Tartars to be pre－ fent at the ratification of this new Tieaty；upon the con－ ciufion of this prace，reveral prifoners of quality akenby our people are to be alfo fer at libetry．

The Staics General of the Rnited Provinces have endeavoured to lectle a right underAndiang between the Electors of Mayence and Palatine and the Duke of Lorrain, and for that end and purpoic have inltuctid the Heer Hamel Bruininx thei intended Refilent to the Empercurs Court at Vienne on his way to negatiare with thofe Princes, and to interpole their meitiation, which be has accordingly fuccelsfully perf rmed with the Eleator of Mest? and Duke of Lortain, the latter more particularly enbracing their interpolition, entertaining their faid Minitler wih extraordinary cisility, and difmiffing him with a Prefent to the value af 300 Fittols $s$ the laid Duke at his departure particulatly obliging him in his applicuion to the Emperour to aflare his-Imperial Majcay of his inclination to terve the intere ft of his houfe, and that he fhould not be eafly drawn into any obligatión to his prejudice. The Prince Elctar Palat: ine has yet fone feruples whith remain urfatisfied, the Heer Hamel Braininx arriving here from Nancy, departs this dey intending for Heidleberg to give the faid E-t lector all $p$,fible fatisfation, but if he find him not to becifily woh upon to accept of the offered Medlation, arter fome litale llay to purlue his intended journey for Diemas

The Binap of this place, has lately cauled to be made and fent ineo France a confiderable number of Euf coats. Some daies fince paffed through sifatia abouc 2000 then faid to be defigned for the recruiting of the Frinch Army; There are Tately arrived feveral Fiench Officers to buy Horfes, and among to othets one Captain Haen with a Comm fition for raifing of men for horle fervice, bue refures to entertain ans; but luch as have been three years in Services

From coblents, we are advifed thathis moft chriftian Majenty d:mateded paifige of the Archilihop of Triers for Thred bhoufdind m.n forough his Councrey.

At Bachar $f$ ch and other places upon the Rhin;, moft of the Wine which was laden in'Boats, was frozen chrough by the violence of the late froft, bas upon the thaw, the Ice flowed town with fo great a force, that aboye fifty Boacs were broken in pieces and deftroyed.

The Deputies from the Nobility of Holfeis are gone from hence to Kiel to be prefent at an Alembly fummoned to be beld there,"

Malmuyen in the Provines of Schonta; not is there yes any cercainty what may be the fubje af of that Negotizion; the principal perions who are prefent in the Afembly, are the Sieur Pontus do ta Garde and the Sieur Ebbe Hiefeld both of them Members of the Se ate of Smeden, with the Bifhops of Lundex and Gutsenbourg, with allithe Nu: bility of the Countrey.

The French Nortlern Company of Merchants give notice of a great Convoy of their filips laden with wines and Salt, which ehey defign for the Northern paris this next fpring, and talk of eftablithing a Magazine at C. ningsbergue for Ceveral Cores of Merclandiles, projecting allotor a confiderable fum of Moneys to prevail with his Highnefs the Ele Ctor of Brandenbourg, that chey may have the piviledge of the fole Vending and Trading in thofe Commodicies, which does not at all pleafe cibbes the States or people of thofe parts.

The Depuries the e affemblid, are now vignrcully preffing the feeedy ${ }^{\text {rs }}$ fing of Forses for the defence of the Empire, to which they are the more zealoully inclined upe on tke receipt of leveral Letters, which give them intelligence that the Turks are making great preparations for war at Eelgrade, which is a place conveniendy fcisuated for the fend ng away their forces for the Invafion either of Fo. land or Hungary, whigh giv.s equal alarums to both Countreys ; and has particularly fo much wrought uponthe Emperor, that he intends in few daies to call rogether all his principal Miniters! to take tleir aivice whar mettodis Fiteft to be caken for ithe defence of the Kingdam of Hung, gary in cale of Invafion.

The 20 Inftant, The Prince and Biftop of Aiehfade the Emperors Commiffioner at that Diet, went with the Plenjpotentiaries and Deputies of the Roman Catholifk Princus concerned in that, affembly to the $\rceil$ duis Church s where they heard Te Deum fung for the Emperors happfy recovely from his late diftemper; the Proteltants meeting alfo jn thejr Charches to gire thanks to Gotypon the Gma occafion, all of them highty expreffing their grear joy zodr farisfaction at the arrival of that welcome news.
