Berne, Febr. 11. N. S. The Diet of Baden have employ'd their Time with much Diligence in forming several Projects of a Neutrality for Neufcharel. The Roman-Catholick Cantons have attempted to limit it in such a manner as to have Respect to the French Pretenders; but the Protessants have insisted upon a simple and absolute Neutrality without any Restrictions whatsoever, according to their first Instructions. This Constancy in the Protessants has obliged the Roman-Catholicks to content themselves with a general Reserve, and leave the Right of each Pretender as a Matter not before them; insisting only on a Neutrality for that Country at present, till the Repose of it is better secured by a general Peace. The Diet have hereupon unanimously made a Representation to the French Ambailador for such a Neutrality; to which that Minister seems to incline, provided they will give him the necessary Securities for the Observance of it on the Part of the King of Prussa. However this Representation is not wholly approved here, because they seemed to ask the Neutrality as a Matter of Grace and Favour; whereas they ought to have demanded it as a Right grounded upon the perpetual Alliance with France, and the Treaty of Neutrality made in 1702-, by which Neuschatel is acknowledged part of Swisserland, and entitled to all its Rights and Privileges. The Bitish Envoy presented a Memorial to this Canton on this Occasion, to animate their Resolutions, with an Assurance of Her Majesty's Assurance in case Neuschatel should be attack'd; and the Canton Yesterday sent new Directions to their Deputies absolutely to insist upon the Acknowledgment of Neuschatel as part of Swisserland, and to affect its Title to the Neutrality which the rest of the Helvetick Body enjoys by Vertue of the perpetual Alliance with France renew'd in 1663, and of the Treaty made in 1702.
