Notice is hereby given that the Urban District of Hinckley proposes to make an Order under subsection (1) of section 81 of the Road Traffic Act 1960, subsection (2) of section 11 of, and subsection (1) of section 16 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act 1960 the effect of which will be to authorise the use as a parking place of each of the lengths of road mentioned for the periods specified in the Schedule to this notice.

SCHEDULB

Trinity Lane, Hinckley, west side, between Mansion Street and a point 67 yards north of Coventry Road.

Lower Bond Street, Hinckley, east side, between a point 50 yards south of the

Hollybush Inn and the southern boundary of No. 13 Lower Bond Street.

Lancaster Road, Hinckley, north side, between a point 15 yards east of Regent

Street and a point 15 yards west of George Street. South side between Station Road and the Bus Station entrance.

George Street, Hinckley, west side, between a point 15 yards north of Lancaster Road and a point 15 yards south of Regent Street.

(a) North side of that part of the road which adjoins the southern boundary of the Church of England School. Diagonally to the wall.

(b) Both sides of that part of the road which adjoins the eastern boundaries of the Public Baths and the premises of Parsons, Sherwin & Co. Ltd.

(c) South side of that part of the road which runs in an easterly direction from the junction with Station Road.

Castle Street, Hinckley, south side, between a point 7 yards east of the entrance to the "Kings Head" yard adjacent to No. 69 Castle Street and a point 3 yards west of Hill Street but excluding the entrance to Bailey's Yard.

The Order will authorise the Council to close the parking places to prevent obstruction, and will prohibit unreasonable obstruction of access to adjoining premises.

The engines of parked vehicles will be required to be stopped, and the sale of articles from parked vehicles will be prohibited.

The draft Order and plans showing the lengths of road affected may be seen at the Clerk's Department, 23 Station Road, Hinckley, during normal office hours.
