(i) between the north-western kerbline of North Circular Road and a point opposite the party wall of Nos 405 and 407 Neasden Lane;

(b) the south side, between the western kerb-line of Sydney Road and a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 20 and 22 Palace Gardens;
(c) the west side, between a point opposite the southern flank wall of No. 12 Palace Gardens and

the southern kerb-line of Church Street, Enfield.

Silver Street, Enfield between the northern kerbline of Portcullis Lodge Road and its junction with London Road.

(b) the west side, between a point opposite the southern flank wall of No. 7 London Road and its junction with Silver Street, Enfield.

Silver Street, Enfield between a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 13 and 15 Silver Street and its junction with London Road.

Southbury Road

(a) the north side, between its junction with The Town, Enfield and a point 70 feet west of the western kerb line of St. Andrew's Road;

(b) the south side, between its junction with The Town, Enfield and the western kerb-line of Genotin Road.

Windmill Hill the north side, between a point opposite the western flank wall of No. 77 Windmill Hill and the western kerb-line of Florence
