WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1959

Rubber Proofed Garment Making Industry Wages Council

The Rubber Proofed Garment Making Industry Wages Council hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Rubber Proofed Garment) Order 1965 (Order RPG (17)) as amended by Schedule 1 to the Wages Regulation (Rubber Proofed Garment) (Amendment) Order, 1966 (RPG (20)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Rubber Proofed Garment) (Holidays) Order, 1965 (RPG (18)) as amended by Schedule 2 to the Wages Regulation (Rubber Proofed Garment) (Amendment) Order 1966 (RPG (20)); and (3) the revocation of Order RPG (19), Order RPG (18) and Order RPG (20).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 27th September 1966. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Rubber Proofed Garment Making Industry Wages Council, Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

Bradford

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that she has made an Order under section 153 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (City and County Borough of Bradford) (No. 3) Order 1966" authorising the stopping up of a length of footpath off King Street at Bradford and requiring the provision of a new highway.

Bolton-on-Deerne, Yorks.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that she proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a length of Ingsfield Lane at Bolton-on-Deerne, Yorkshire, to enable development, consisting of tipping of colliery waste material, to be carried out by the National Coal Board in accordance with planning permission granted by Deerne U.D.C.

The diversion to be authorised will involve the provision of a new highway maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Deerne U.D.C.

Luton, Beds

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that she proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a length of footpath at Luton Airport, Luton, Beds, in order to enable development, consisting of an extension to the runway to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Luton C.B.C. by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The diversion to be authorised will involve the provision of a new footpath maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Bedford C.C.

Sheffield
