## CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD

St. James's Palace, London S.W.1.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointment to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:

*To be an Additional Member of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order, for Gallantry.*

Lieutenant Derek Joseph GLARVEY (480156), Royal Armoured Corps.

On 31st March 1966, Lieutenant Glarvey was commanding the A1 Echelon of the Regiment during a period of training on the Soltau Training Area. His Echelon had just moved into location south-east of Bispingen and close to the railway line Bispingen-Soltau. He was in his command vehicle. At 0850 hours an accident occurred between a Ferret Scout Car of the Regimental Reconnaissance Troop and a civilian train on an unguarded railway crossing a short distance from the Echelon area. Hearing the sound of the accident and subsequently seeing what appeared to be an explosion and fire, Lieutenant Glarvey ran to the scene of the accident. He found that a Ferret Scout Car Mark II had been hit by a train and was lying overturned and in flames beside the railway line. The turret had been removed by the impact and one member of the crew was trapped within it with his clothing alight from the hips downward.

Lieutenant Glarvey quickly took command of the situation, rapidly obtaining fire-fighting equipment and with assistance pulled the turret clear of the trapped commander who was unconscious and died some ten minutes later. A second gravely injured man was discovered lying some fifteen yards from the scene. He left the two known casualties in the care of the Regimental Medical Officer now present. His knowledge of the dying commander and the seriously injured casualty led him to believe that the driver of the scout car had not yet been located. He moved to the scout car which was still in flames although the fire was being tackled. He cleared wreckage from the escape hatch and attempted to look inside but flames and smoke made vision impossible.

The scout car was completely full with fuel, just having replenished within the Echelon, and the danger of an explosion was ever present. Regardless of the danger he continued clearing kit and equipment from inside the car. He discovered the legs of the driver, and in view of the accident, the flames and the smoke, he thought the driver must be dead, but nevertheless with the subsequent assistance of the Regimental Medical Officer he managed to remove

the unconscious man. At this later stage the flames had been extinguished. As a result of the accident the commander and passenger died of their injuries but the driver survived and is again fit for normal duties.

Lieutenant Glarvey displayed outstanding qualities in taking quick command and control of an emergency. With speed, efficiency and coolness he ordered rescue and fire-fighting operations.

There is no doubt the driver owes his life to Lieutenant Glarvey, who displayed outstanding qualities and cool courage and a complete disregard for his own safety.

On 19th June 1966, a serious accident involving two civilian vehicles, a taxi and an estate car, occurred on the Brunei-Seria road. At a bend in the road the two cars had collided causing the estate car, with nine passengers on board, to burst into flames, and the driver of the taxi to be completely trapped in his driving seat. There was an imminent danger that the fire might at any moment spread to the taxi, for the estate car was fiercely burning.

Shortly after the crash, a military landrover driven by Corporal Grieve and carrying other members of his unit reached the accident. Corporal Grieve immediately despatched his vehicle to summon help, posted a traffic sentry to prevent further disasters, and with one soldier, Private Munro, ran to the crash.

On reaching the burning car he found a man screaming in pain near the car with all his clothes alight; he immediately seized a tarpaulin and rolled the man in it to smother the flames. Another injured man holding a two year old boy lay near the burning car; together with Private Munro he moved them both to safety.

The intensity of the fire which by now had engulfed the entire car made any further rescue of its occupants impossible. Meanwhile, in the other vehicle, the taxi driver remained trapped by his legs and terrified that his taxi would also catch fire.

Finding all the doors of the taxi jammed, Corporal Grieve smashed open a rear window, climbed in, broke open a rear door and then with the help of Private Munro smashed the front driver's door open by using a pickaxe against the main door post.

The taxi driver, who was suffering from severe leg injuries was then freed from the entangled dash board and lifted out of his seat, assisted by some local men whose help Corporal Grieve had enlisted.

Throughout the rescue Corporal Grieve displayed a cool but most forceful standard of leadership without which it is unlikely that the taxi driver could have been saved. Obviously aware that the taxi might also catch fire at any moment, he did not hesitate to crawl into the taxi, whose doors were jammed, to start the rescue of the driver.

His leadership, initiative and courage were of a high order.

## MINISTRY OF DEFENCE

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers to approve the following awards in recognition of gallant conduct in Vietnam:

### *Military Cross*

Captain Alexander Hugh MACGREGOR (63507), Australian Staff Corps.

Captain MACGREGOR entered the Royal Military College, DUNTRON, in February 1957, and graduated in December 1960, being assigned to the Royal Australian Engineers. He attended SYDNEY University during 1961-62, where he gained a Bachelor of Engineering degree. He then served with field engineer units in AUSTRALIA and NEW GUINEA before being posted in August 1965 to Officer Commanding 3 Field Troop, which he raised and brought to VIETNAM a month later.

Despite the problems involved in having been raised shortly before being committed to operations, the Troop, under Captain MACGREGOR's leadership, began tackling the many and varied engineering tasks awaiting them with outstanding spirit and efficiency. They have continued to operate along these lines, and by working long hours and displaying considerable ingenuity, have contributed significantly to improving the living conditions in the BIEN HOA area.

The Troop has taken part in five operations with First Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, performing splendidly in all of them. In addition to normal engineering tasks, it has, during the operations in the IRON TRIANGLE area in October 1965, carried out the very dangerous and difficult tasks of clearing extensive areas of cleverly contrived and concealed enemy booby traps and mines. During Operation "CRIMP" in January 1966, the Troop located, defined and cleared three quarters of a mile of intricate and dangerous tunnel and bunker systems, mainly by crawling through them, where all the advantages lay with the concealed VIET CONG within the tunnels.

Captain MACGREGOR as Troop Commander has in the most dangerous and trying periods of operations, shown outstanding leadership, technical and planning ability and complete disregard for his own safety. All his tasks have been carried out in an exemplary manner. The proven ability of 3 Field Troop, and its very high rating among other units in the area, is due largely to his dedicated leadership, courage and ability.

### *Military Medal*

52506 Warrant Officer Class II Leslie Daniel OSBORN, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

Warrant Officer OSBORN served in the Australian Imperial Force from 1940 to 1945 with the 2/11th Infantry Battalion. He subsequently served in KOREA with the 3rd Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment. Warrant Officer OSBORN was posted to the Australian Army Training Team in VIETNAM in August 1964.

From March 1965 to July 1965 Warrant Officer OSBORN was a member of the advisory team to the 1st Battalion, 3rd Regiment of the 1st Infantry Division, Army of the Republic of VIETNAM. During this period he took part in numerous operations in which his performance was consistently outstanding.

The advisory team was composed of Warrant Officer OSBORN, Captain CHALMERS (U.S. Army), the team leader, and Sergeant First Class ALLEN (U.S. Army). On 29th May 1965 the 1st Battalion moved on a reinforcement operation from NAM DONG to KHE TRE in THUA THIEN Province. At about 1350 hours the Battalion Headquarters Company, with which Warrant Officer OSBORN was moving, came under heavy mortar, automatic weapons and small arms fire from a superior Viet Cong force which had been waiting in ambush positions. Quickly assessing the position Warrant Officer OSBORN assisted the battalion commander and Captain CHALMERS in locating the opposing force, including automatic weapons and 81mm mortar positions. At considerable personal risk he then gave covering fire to Captain CHALMERS whilst the latter called by radio for air support.

Seeing that the Vietnamese soldiers were becoming demoralised and disorganised in the face of the heavy Viet Cong attack and were starting to fall back, Warrant Officer OSBORN repeatedly exposed himself to heavy enemy fire in his efforts to encourage the soldiers to hold their ground. At this point the Battalion Commander was killed, Captain CHALMERS was wounded and the Vietnamese soldiers withdrew in disorder, leaving the advisory team on their own. Whilst Sergeant ALLEN called for a helicopter to evacuate Captain CHALMERS, Warrant Officer OSBORN dressed the latter's wound and, by his own fire, held off the enemy who continued to press their attack. Then, with Warrant Officer OSBORN and Sergeant ALLEN alternately giving covering fire and assisting Captain CHALMERS, the three men withdrew before the pursuing Viet Cong to a point 400 yards distant where a helicopter was able to land.

6280 Sergeant James Windemere CARNES, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

Sergeant CARNES enlisted in the Australian Regular Army in December 1948, and has since served with 15 National Service Training Battalion and Second Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, including service in MALAYA. In 1963 he joined First Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, and since its arrival in VIETNAM in June 1965, he has been a platoon sergeant in D Company.

On 24th November 1965, The Battalion was engaged on Operation "NEW LIFE" in the BINH TUY Province of VIETNAM. D Company was given the task of assaulting CHINH DUC, a fortified Viet Cong village. Sergeant CARNES's platoon was chosen to lead the assault. As the platoon entered the village, medium machine gun and other automatic fire was received from approximately 12 to 15 Viet Cong in entrenchments around a fortified position. In the subsequent platoon attack which was mounted, the reserve section and platoon commander became detached from the assaulting sections due to the nature of the terrain.

In closing with the Viet Cong position, the assaulting sections came under direct fire and one of our machine guns jammed. Covering this with fire from his own weapon, Sergeant CARNES took personal command of the group and shouting encouragement led them forward against the objective. Confused and surprised by the aggressive attack, the Viet Cong were driven from the position, leaving 11 dead. The platoon suffered NO casualties, and CHINH DUC was occupied without further loss.

Showing outstanding leadership, aggressiveness and courage under fire Sergeant CARNES inspired his men at a difficult time and contributed greatly to the success of the operation.

53652 Corporal (temporary Sergeant) George Alexander SMITH, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

Sergeant SMITH enlisted in the Australian Regular Army on 23rd January 1959, and since that date has served in the First, Second, Fourth and Fifth Battalions of The Royal Australian Regiment.

In May 1965, Sergeant SMITH joined First Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, accompanying the unit to VIETNAM in June 1965, where he has performed the duties of platoon sergeant and platoon commander, 9 Platoon C Company.

On operations in War Zone D, the BEN CAT and IRON TRIANGLE areas, Sergeant SMITH has carried out his tasks with skill and determination. His constant display of courage under fire has been a source of inspiration to his men. This together with the leadership and loyalty which he has shown at all

times causes him to be held in very high regard by all ranks.

On the morning of 26th November 1965, the Battalion was engaged in Operation "NEW LIFE" in BINH TUY Province. Sergeant SMITH was travelling in the leading armoured personnel carrier of a force which was moving to the enemy defended village of VO XU. As the armoured column approached the gates of the village, the enemy opened fire with machine guns and other small arms. Although the major part of the enemy fire was directed at the leading carrier, Sergeant SMITH, with complete disregard for his own safety, moved on foot to the gates, opened them and checked for surface mines and booby traps. With the gates open, and the armoured personnel carriers moving through, the Viet Cong were un-nerved and some of them withdrew, failing to detonate two high explosive booby traps which would have caused severe damage to the carrier. On this occasion, his quick thinking enabled the Australian Force to occupy VO XU quickly and effectively without dangerous delays and much heavier casualties.

214633 Private Lyndon WARING, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

Private WARING joined the Australian Regular Army in March 1962 and served in MALAYA with The Royal Australian Regiment from February 1963 to October 1964. He accompanied First Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment to VIETNAM in June 1965.

During operations in the BEN CAT—IRON TRIANGLE area on 12th October 1965, his platoon was given the task of clearing an area known to contain an enemy machine gun which had shot at and damaged five helicopters. During this search Private WARING, who was forward scout, followed a trail leading into a Viet Cong camp encircled by trenches and bunkers. From the huts in the centre of the camp he could hear voices, and, followed by his second scout, he carefully made his way to the centre of the camp where he opened fire on and killed a Viet Cong who was armed with a machine gun. His section had closed up behind him by this time, and also engaged the Viet Cong who, completely surprised fled leaving two officers dead and a machine gun and an automatic rifle. Signs indicated that three others who escaped were seriously wounded.

By an outstanding display of calmness, courage and initiative, Private WARING enabled his section to surprise the Viet Cong completely, to inflict a number of important casualties on the enemy and enabled the Brigade operation to proceed with NO further interference to the helicopters from this area.

215584 Private Raymond Stanley FRASER, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

Private FRASER accompanied First Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment to VIETNAM in June 1965, as a member of B Company.

During operations in the BEN CAT area on 22nd September 1965, his section was ordered to clear an area containing an enemy sniper, section size groups of Viet Cong were also active in the area. As his section completed one phase of the search, Private FRASER and another soldier took up fire positions to cover the next move. As they reached their positions, a sniper shot Private FRASER in the leg, inflicting a serious wound. Private FRASER informed his section commander of the sniper's location and, despite his injury and exposed position, provided covering fire to cover his section's deployment to deal with the sniper, refusing aid until the action had been completed.

By his presence of mind and courage, he inspired his section, prevented further casualties and ensured the success of the action.

On 19th June 1966, a serious accident involving two civilian vehicles, a taxi and an estate car, occurred on the Brunei-Seria road. The vehicles collided at a bend in the road, and the estate car, carrying nine passengers burst into flames, the driver of the taxi being trapped in his driving seat.

Private Munro was a passenger in a military vehicle which reached the crash shortly after it happened, on the orders of Corporal Grieve he immediately assisted the evacuation of those injured passengers thrown clear of the burning car. He organised bystanders to administer first aid, whilst he helped Corporal Grieve to rescue the trapped taxi driver.

Private Munro displayed courage, initiative and a disregard for his own safety which resulted in the taxi driver being saved from almost certain death.
