

provides, by revoking existing fixed rates of drawback, for drawback of import duty related to the duty paid on the imported goods actually used in the manufacture of the exported goods and, in the case of the goods specified in sub-paragraphs (c) and (e) above, removes the condition for drawback that duty shall have been paid at not less than a specified rate;

(3) varies the rate of drawback of import duty in respect of the following exported goods:—

(a) animal black of certain descriptions manufactured from certain imported bones;

(b) apricot kernel products manufactured from certain imported apricot kernels;

(c) cigarette papers in the form of booklets manufactured from certain imported cigarette paper; and

(d) certain soya bean oil manufactured from imported soya beans;

(4) corrects the description of certain imported woods used in the manufacture of exported veneer sheets to conform with the Customs Tariff.

The Order comes into operation on 6th October 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966, No. 1220.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:— The Import Duties (General) (No. 8) Order, 1966.

This Order makes two amendments in the Customs Tariff consequential upon clarification approved by the Customs Co-operation Council in the English text of the Brussels Nomenclature. It amends—

(a) paragraph (c) of the note to Chapter 2 to make it clear that animal fat classified in Chapter 2 includes only animal fat of the type covered by heading 02-05;

(b) note 6 (b) to section XI to make clear the meaning of the expression "made up" in relation to certain textile goods.

It also amends heading 90-25 of the Customs Tariff to preserve the previous rate of import duty on environmental test chambers following their reclassification under this heading.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th October 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966 No. 1219.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT 1965

Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorities

(Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley)

Whereas the authorities conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953 on Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley, M.B., Ch.B., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations applied were

withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 29 of the said Regulations by notices published in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette* on 13th May 1960, the said Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley, whose registered address was then 408 Wimbledon Park Road, London S.W.19, having been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act 1951:

And whereas at the same time the Secretary of State directed that it should not be lawful for the said Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953:

And whereas the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1953 have been revoked and by virtue of Regulation 33 of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964, the said withdrawal and direction are deemed to have been done and given under the said Regulations of 1964:

And whereas by virtue of Regulation 22 of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964 the Secretary of State is empowered at any time to restore such an authority as aforesaid which has been withdrawn under the said Regulations, or to suspend such a withdrawal:

And whereas I am satisfied that it is expedient to suspend the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley:

Now, therefore, I hereby suspend, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 22 of the Dangerous Drugs (No. 2) Regulations 1964, the said withdrawal of authorities from the said Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley, and I further suspend the operation of the said direction regarding prescriptions given by the said Peter Louis Milbourne Hartley.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962
