Part One: Highways to be closed to all traffic.
Part width of Church Street between points B and C (a distance of 49 feet) between points D and E (a distance of 61 feet) and between points F and G (a distance of 46 feet).

Church Street between points G and H (a distance

of 80 feet).

King Street between points I and K (a distance of 86 feet).

Assheton Street between points O and P (a distance of 68 feet).

Part width of Assheton Street between points Q to R (a distance of 68 feet).

Part Two: Highways to be closed subject to the retention of a right of foot passage.

Part width of Church Street between points A and

G (a distance of 201 feet) and between points S and M (a distance of 9 feet).

King Street between points I and J (a distance of 16 feet) and between points K and L (a distance of 9 feet).

Part width of Assheton Street between points N and O (a distance of 116 feet) and between points P and R (a distance of 137 feet).

The above Order made on the 28th day of September 1966, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert part of footpath No. W.127 which runs from Holly Walk, Learnington Spa, to Offchurch Village, being a part which starts from a point in Offchurch Bury Park where the said path intersects the main estate drive to Offchurch Bury, and runs east-south-east and east over field No. 219 for a distance of approximately 490 yards to the southern most boundary point of the woodland No. 219 for a distance of approximately 490 yards to the southern-most boundary point of the woodland known as the Grove, Offchurch Bury Park, to a line starting at the aforementioned point of intersection with the estate drive, and following the said estate drive in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 307 yards and then approximately 200 yards northeast across field No. 219 to the boundary of the Grove, Offchurch Bury Park, then along the hedgeline eastwards and then south-eastwards for approxiline eastwards and then south-eastwards for approxi-mately 73 yards to re-join the line of the existing path at the southernmost boundary point of the Grove.
