Vienna, February 22. N.S.
Onlignor Piazza, late Nuncio in Poland, is arriv'd here on his Way to Rome. The Cardinal of Saxe-Zeits has fet out from hence, accompany'd by feveral Hungarian Prelates, who are to assist at the ensuing Diet which is to be held in that Place. Mr. Guarient is return'd to this Court from Sirmium, whither he was fent by his Imperial Maify to be present at the Election of a Patriarch for the Daysin order to receive the Emperor's Confirmation. Berne, Febr. 25 N. S. This Canton has writ circular Letters to all the others, about the Alterations which they think necessary to be made in the Project of Neutrality for Neufchatel, wherein they fet forth the Reasons upon which they ground their Demand, and defire that all the Cantons would infiruct the Departes whom they shall fend to the next Diet to concur with them in those This Canton has likewife writ to the French Ambassador upon the same Subject, who yesterday seint them an Answer, wherein he tells them, That he had transmitted to Court their Project as it was delivered to him by the Deputies, before this Canton thought fit to demand that those Alterations might be made; that he would likewise inform his Master of these Changes, but that he believ'd neither he nor the Catholick Cantons would agree to them, especially to that Article wherein they infift that Neufchatel should be accknowleg'd to be Part of Swifferland. There are to many Difficulties arise in adjusting a further Treaty upon this Affair, that it is believ'd the Cantons will content themselves with a publick Declaration from the French King and the King of Prussia, wherein each shall promise to forbear all Acts of Hostility between Franche Compté and Neufchatel during the present War, of which Declarations the Cantons may be mutual Guarantées.

Hague, March & N.S. Letters from the Upper Rhine say, That the Marshal Villars had made a Detachment of 2000 Men, confitting of Horse and Dragoons; to serve in Flanders; and that he was to be reinforc'd in Alsatia with an equal Body from the Franche Compté.
