#### BARROW-IN-FURNESS COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Barrow-in-Furness (Kendal Street) (Parking Place) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th day of October 1966, the Barrow-in-Furness County Borough Council made an Order under section 81 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and subsection (2) of section 11 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, which comes into operation on the 5th day of December 1966, and the effect of which is to permit waiting on all days between 9 a.m. and 11.30 p.m. for a maximum period of three hours on the north-west side of Kendal Street from the junction of Kendal Street with Victoria Road for a distance of fifty feet measured in a southerly direction and also between a point 75 feet from the said junction and a point 215 feet from such junction measured in a south-westerly direction. The byelaws which created a street parking place in Victoria Road are revoked by this Order.

#### BEESTON AND STAPLEFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

*The Beeston and Stapleford Urban District Council (Traffic Regulation) (Warren Avenue, Stapleford) Order, 1966.*

Notice is hereby given that the Beeston and Stapleford Urban District Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic

Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in Warren Avenue, Stapleford in the county of Nottingham (a) on the north-east side for a distance of 330 feet from its junction with Derby Road (A.52) and (b) on the south-west side between a point 220 feet from its junction with Derby Road (A.52) and a point 315 feet from that junction.

The Order will contain exemptions to permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of allowing persons to board or alight, enabling works to be carried out and loading or unloading goods.

A draft of the proposed Order and of a map indicating the lengths of road affected thereby are available for inspection at the offices of the undersigned, to whom objections to the proposals must be sent in writing by 11th November 1966.

#### BATH CITY COUNCIL

*The City of Bath (Central Area) (General Traffic Regulation) Order, 1966*

*The City of Bath (Central Area) (Street Parking Places) Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the Bath City Council propose to make the following Orders under sections 26 and 81 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, respectively:

1. *The City of Bath (Central Area) (General Traffic Regulation) Order 1966.*

The effect of this Order will be:

(a) to institute one-way traffic working on the roads or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto; and to prohibit vehicles in George Street from making a right-hand turn into Gay Street and vehicles in Northgate Street from making a right-hand turn into Upper Borough Walls;

(b) to prohibit waiting by any vehicle (subject to the exemptions mentioned below) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. every day (except Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays) in the roads specified in Part I of Schedule 2 hereto or in parts of such roads, and for the whole 24 hours every day in the roads specified in Part II of the said Schedule 2 or in parts of such roads.

Exemptions will be made from the no waiting provisions for persons boarding or alighting from a vehicle or loading or unloading personal luggage; delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle; vehicles engaged in building and the like operations; removing obstructions; road works and statutory undertakers' works; fire brigade, ambulance, police or local authorities' vehicles; hackney carriages on an approved stand; post office delivery or collection vehicles; public service vehicles at authorised stopping places, termini or turning points; vehicles taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage; furniture removal vehicles; hospital car service vehicles at the Hot Springs Treatment Centre or the Royal National Hospital for Rheumatic Diseases; vehicles of registered medical practitioners whilst attending at premises (other than their surgeries); disabled persons' vehicles for a period not exceeding 30 minutes; vehicles used in connection with weddings or funerals; and vehicles used by window cleaners and bill posters; and

(c) to revoke all provisions of existing local traffic orders which will be superseded by the provisions of this Order, or are redundant.

2. *The City of Bath (Central Area) (Street Parking Places) Order, 1966.*

The effect of this Order will be:

(a) to authorise parts of the roads specified in Schedule 3 hereto to be used as street parking places between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. every day (except Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays), free of charge, but
