#### EPPING AND ONGAR RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

*Rural District Council of Epping and Ongar (Stanford Rivers Hall Farm, Stanford Rivers) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1966.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th day of October 1966 the Ministry of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the following paths or parts of paths:

1. Part of the public footpath No. 42 in the Parish of Stanford Rivers, commencing on the western side of the road leading from Hare Street to St. Margaret's Church approximately 30 feet from the south-eastern corner of enclosure 458, which is entered by a wooden stile and, approximately 1,500 feet south-east of St. Margaret's Church, running in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,320 feet across enclosures 458, 456 and into enclosure 459 continuing into and across enclosure 407 for a distance of approximately 1,200 feet to a point approximately 90 feet from the north-western corner of enclosure 407 and being opposite the entrance to The Old Rectory.
2. The public footpath No. 45 in the Parish of Stanford Rivers commencing on the northern side of Hare Street, approximately 1,050 feet from the south-western corner of enclosure 460 which is entered by a wooden stile running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,000 feet across enclosure 460 to the north-western boundary of that enclosure through an open gateway into and along the eastern boundary of enclosure 459 for a distance of approximately 880 feet to the north-eastern corner of that enclosure where it joins the path referred to in 1 above.
