

## NATIONAL COAL BOARD

## THE OPENCAST COAL ACT, 1958

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Power, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act, 1958, granted on the 24th day of October 1966, to the National Coal Board an authorisation entitled the Donington Authorisation, 1966, to work coal by opencast operations or cause or permit coal to be worked by opencast operations.

The land comprised in the authorisation is described in the schedule hereto.

A copy of the authorisation and of the map referred to therein can be inspected at the offices of the National Coal Board Opencast Executive, East Midlands Region, Regional Headquarters, Cinderhill Road, Cinderhill, Nottingham and at No. 3 Group Headquarters, Stanleigh House, Donisthorpe, Burton-on-Trent, Staffordshire, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 1.30 p.m. to 4.45 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

The authorisation becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published in a local newspaper, or the date on which it is first published in the *London Gazette*, whichever is the later date, but if any person aggrieved by the authorisation desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that the authorisation is not empowered to be granted under the above-mentioned Act, or desires to question the validity thereof on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the authorisation, he may within six weeks from the date on which the authorisation becomes operative make application to the High Court under paragraph 15 of the First Schedule to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act, 1946, as applied by paragraph 9 of the First Schedule to the Opencast Coal Act, 1958.

## CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Axbridge Rural District Council (Cheddar) Public Path Diversion Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th day of October 1966, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way which crosses in a south-eastwards direction part Ordnance Survey No. 645a known as "Hamfield" in the Parish of Cheddar in the County of Somerset, from the north-western corner of the field to a point on its southern boundary, to a line running southwards from the said north-western corner of the field to its south-western corner, thence eastwards to the point where the existing public right of way passes through the said southern boundary of the field. The old length of path will be closed on the 21st day of November 1966.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, West Street, Axbridge, Somerset, on any weekday (except Saturday) during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 4th day of November 1966, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
