1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 11th November 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £150,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th November to Saturday the 19th November 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DRAFT SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Factories Act 1961

In pursuance of section 180 of, and Schedule 4 to, the Factories Act 1961, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he proposes to make special Regulations imposing requirements for the health and welfare of persons employed in factories and certain warehouses, in which there are handled or processed certain kinds of hair and wool from which there is a risk of anthrax infection. The proposed Regulations will supersede three sets of earlier Regulations relating to certain kinds of hair and wool which were made in 1905, 1907 and 1908.

Any objection to the draft Regulations by, or on behalf of, persons affected must be sent to the Minister on or before 15th December 1966.

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions, or modifications asked for.
