The Humble Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council Affembled.

The to affure Your Majesty, That the repeated Tenders of Lives and Fertunes are not empty Words; but that were ready, upon the first Occasion to demonstrate to all the World our unfeigned Loy liy, by expessing our selves, and all that we have, in the Defence and Support of Your Sured Ferson and Royal Dignity, and Maintenance of the Prouftant Succession, agai st that Pretender and vis Abettors, and all other Your Enemies, both at Home and Abroad.

Barbadoes, Desemb. 6. The Greenwich Man of War, which lately fail'd from hence to Anregoa, return'd hither on the 25th of the last Month with an Express from Colonel Parke, Governor of the Leeward Islands, to his Excellency the Governor, with Intelligence, that a Plag of Truce, which had been fent to Martinico, had trought Advice, That on the 10th of the same Month Alapiral Ship of France had arriv'd there; which was followed by feven more great Ships the next Day, commonded by Monsieur Ducasse; that there came in also two other French Ships of forty Guns each, and several Privateurs of another France lay in the Road; that the Privateers of good Force lay in the Road; that the finateers were all call'd in, and all the Carpenters, with other uccessary Artificers belonging to the Island, were fimmon'd to fit out their flat-bottom'd Boats; and that Monsieur Coliet, a French Major-General, was dispatch'd in one of the Ships of forty Guns for Tabago, in order to join eighteen Men of War, which they expected to arrive at that Island. Colonel Parke further added, That before the Arrival of Monsieur Ducassic, the Prisomers taken in a finall Vessel of Marrinico, by a Privateer of Anregoa, had confessed upon Examination, that he was impatiently expected with thirty Sail of Men of War, and that they were design dagainst Earladoes. Upon Receipt of these A Linear Landon Countries of the Coun Receipt of these Advices the Governor call'd the Council and Affembly, who upon the first reading of his Excellency's Letters unanimously went into the necessistence. play Measure for their common Safety. Orders were immediately iffu'd for repairing the Forts and Breatt-Works. All the Militia of the Illand is divided into two Bolies, which have alternately come upon Duty, and re-cler'd such other for eight Days last past: And for our

further Defence; it is agreed. The Captain of each Company to have four Ne-The three Men of War appointed for the Guard of the Island are hall'd in, and unrigg'd; 20 of the lower Tire of Guns belonging to the Greenwich are brought ashore, and planted on a liatrery, by means of which, and the throwing up new Works, we are as strong as we can make our felves in our Fortificetions; and are capable of bringing together 10000 Men at the first Alarm, including the two Regimens of Negroes. In order to make those Slaves in our Interests in the time of Danger, his Excellency propos'd an Act to the Affembly and Council, which was immediately pass'd, that any Slave, who shall kill an Enemy, or other-wise distinguish himself, shall have his Liberty for ever, and the Owner of fuch a Slave paid his Value by the Publick. In the mean time we have taken four Sloops into the Publick Service, one of which has been, fince these Advices, at Tabago, and another at Martinice, but saw no Ships, which makes us believe Monsieur Ducasse has failed to the Spanish Coast. However, it was thought expedient this day to send another Sloup to Tabago, to see if he is not since come thither.

Berne, March 7. N. S. The Diet which was appointed to meet on the 11th of this Month, hath been countermanded, and put off to an indefinite time, upon the Refusal of some of the Roman Catholick Cantons to send their Deputies to it. The Pretence of their Resulal is taken from the general Meetings, which happen to be just at the same time, and will not give them leave to attend any other Affairs: But the true Reason is thought to be a Design to make this Canton weary of the Charge they are at, in maintaining their Troops in Neutchatel; and by that means, either force them to comply with the Project of Neutrality, as it was agreed upon at Baden, and delift from the Alterations they have made in den, and delift from the Alterations they have made in it, or elfe recall their Treops, and so leave that Country maked and exposed to the Invasions of the French. whenever they shall think the Conjuncture favourable. This Resolution of those Catholick Cautons is supposed to be taken in Concert with the French Ambassador: But it's thought the just Occasion the King of Prussiand his Allies have of keeping Troops in that Country during the next Caupaign, will soon incline the Adherents to the next Campaign, will foon incline the Adherents to the French Interest to alter their Measures.

Bristol, March 6. On the 4th Instant came in the Eugene Gally, John Hort Commander, in five Weeks from Alicant. Yesterday put in the Berkley Gally, John Hirching Commander; and this day the Mary Gally, James Day Commander, both from Jamaica, having been fix Weeks in their Passage. They left that Island very healthy, and in no Apprehensions of an Enemy.

Pertsmouth, March 9. Yesterday her, Majesty's Ship the Alrord fail'd out of the Harbour to Spithead; where alfo continues the Torkay, Litchfield, Royal Oak, Wolwich, Norwich, Sheerness, Maidston and Bridgewater, with the East-India and West-India Ships, who will fall for the River, as soon as the Wind stands fair.
